

Art Pre-Training and Training Programs

Our Pre - Training & Training Program classes are designed specifically for our students who have already gone through our Foundations classes and have mastered the basic art vocabulary and skills taught in those classes. This program is for the student who is ready to go a little deeper in their training and focus on a specific area that they love. Each of these classes are open to our PreTraining Program students AND our Training Program students.

Pr- Training Program

Length of Programs: September-May

<u>Closed Dates:</u> We would continue to close for Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Spring Break as well as occasional Mondays after big productions or special projects.

Pre-Training Program Opportunities:

Pre Training Program students are invited to choose one, two or three of the below classes that they would like to pursue. The class(es) your student would like to enroll in is fully up to you and your student's interests, and the age they are during the enrollment period.

2D / 3D Classes

The 2D/3D Fine art students will have the opportunity to create artwork that will be displayed in the hallways of Illuminate along with other special project opportunities. During our second unit, students will apply their techniques to larger projects like murals and mixed media 3D sculptures.

Students who participate in digital artforms (Ipad drawing and animation) will be placed in this category -- though the medium is vastly different, the vocabulary, techniques, rules of composition, are similar to traditional drawing and painting.

The 2D/3D track is the most similar to what we have offered at Illuminate in the past. This means that the supply list will most likely be the same, plus or minus a few items. Please expect your student to have 20-40 minutes of homework a week to complete projects.

2D/3D Media classes are for students interested in:

- Charcoal, colored pencil, watercolor, acrylic and clay
- Learn how to draw realistically and exploring the expression of abstract art
- Student who would like guidance in growing their personal portfolio
- Muraling opportunities on the wall of Illuminate and other special projects

Design Classes

Student designers will have the opportunity to take any 2 dimensional sketch and bring it to life. During the design track students will learn the basics of using and making a basic pattern, cutting fabric, hammering and building in wood, sewing fabric together (by hand and by machine) and or constructing designs. Throughout the program students will be introduced to the basics of interior design and stage design. Please expect your student to have 20-40 minutes of homework a week to complete projects.

Design classes are for students interested in:

- Constructing, Building and sewing
- Drafting out set designs on paper and making clay models
- Designing patterns for home decor, clothing, costumes
- Practicing the interior design by designing rooms, spaces, or set pieces
- Working with wood, hammers, and reclaimed materials to make sculpture/ stage props
- Learning about the aft forms of Interior design, Architectural design, Civil Engineering, and how they each plays a role in the design process

Materials and costs will be considered once we know the number of students, and the tools per student has been calculated.

Digital Media Classes

Student photographers will have the opportunity to capture moments throughout other studio classes, during community events and behind the scenes of productions and other projects. During the video unit, students will learn the fundamentals of editing videos, videography and cinematography.

The Digital Media track is the newest addition to the art department's program, materials and costs are still being considered. Once we are able to see how many students are interested, we will be able to further understand the tools needed to begin the program this year. Please expect your student to have 20-40 minutes of homework a week to complete projects.

Digital Media classes are for students interested in:

- Capturing and editing photos, videos, and promotional content
- Photography access during illuminate classes, performances and community events
- Learning foundational photography vocabulary
- Learning how to use basic editing applications
- Interviewing students or staff members to create
- Putting together storylines for creative video projects

Training Program

Interdisciplinary Workshops

Training Program Worship

By definition, an interdisciplinary artist is a person who creates by combining different mediums of art. We are excited to introduce our first Interdisciplinary (ID) Workshop classes exclusively for our Training Program students. This workshop time is best when paired with one of our classes designed for our Pre Training Program classes, this way your student continues to grow in their technical abilities in their favored medium of art. Training program is only available for students who have completed the Foundations Course and are currently

enrolled in at least one Pre-Training program class.

Interdisciplinary (ID) Workshop classes are dedicated to creating in multiple mediums, rather than being dedicated to one medium of art. Workshop classes will not be bound to one expression of art; these students will be using different mediums to create large group projects with Ms. Tumi and the other departments in Illuminate! and departments within the Global Spheres Center.

During Training program workshop time students will join the dance training program for a 30 min Bible Teaching/Prayer/Worship Time.

The projects during workshop class will be hands-on learning, usually applied to large studio projects. Training Program Workshop classes are for students interested in:

- Painting murals
- Using wood and hammers to build set pieces for productions
- Building and installing walk through art installations
- (For those with an interest in design) making patterns, cutting and sewing costumes, flags or props for performers
- Creating clay installations for a hanging art piece
- Creating large art displays for Illuminate or Glory of Zion International Ministries' services
